KEY LEARNING AREAS

Wurundjeri Season - Poorneet (Tadpole)

Sep - Oct

- "The grey clouds are shifting and we see glimpses of opening buds of light and sprinkles of magic dust everywhere."
- Those fast moving little tailed poorneets (tadpoles) appear and there are lots of them. The male bulin bulin (lyrebird) has finished dancing, having found a female partner.
- Growling grass ngarrert (frogs) lay their eggs while the bubup mirrim (young kangaroos) are ready to leave Mum's pouch.
- A very colourful land mass of plants are still in flower
- The temperatures rise, rain continues

Developmental	The Elements of Music	Key Word
Stage	- Lyrics and whole class singing	Sign - Auslan
Nursery	Let's feel the end of the musical phrase through the chord structure of the song. As the teacher plays we can hear the rise and fall of the song. Let's use our instruments to play along as the teacher sings to us.	Frog, Moon, Star, Rocket, Zoom off.
Toddlers	Let's identify different lyrics in the song. We can learn to clap the rhyming words and hear the lyric at the end of a musical phrase. We use gesture and movement to assist with learning lyric structure in the toddlers.	
Kinder 3	Let's practice echoing the teachers' lyrics in a song. Let's listen to the pitch of the lyrics and echo back what we hear.	
Kinder 4/ Pre-Prep	Let's practice echoing the teachers' lyrics in a song. Let's first keep the beat while the teacher sing, then let's say the rhythm of the lyrics (the syllables), then let's sing the pitch of the lyrics while we play an instrument.
